DEPUTY KOTFILA MEMORIAL DOG PARK



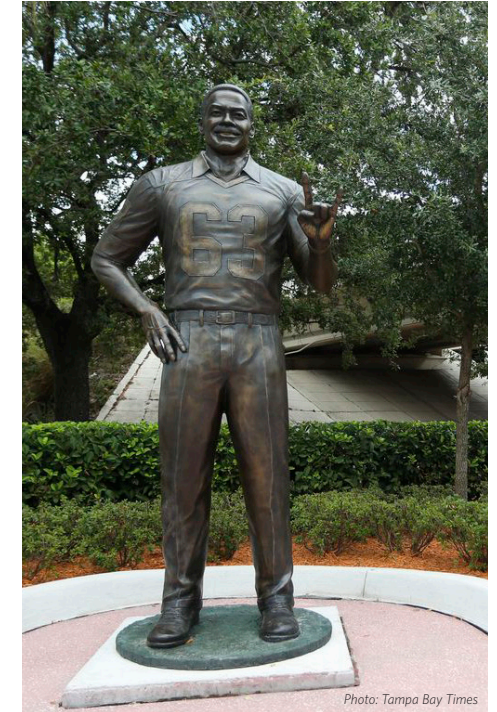
The Deputy Kotfila Memorial Dog Park has plenty of room for dogs of all sizes to socialize, with separate play areas for small and large dogs. THEA installed top-of-the-line canine turf, which is safer for puppy paws, more durable, and requires less maintenance – all under the Selmon Expressway shade.

FRAMES ON FRANKLIN



THEA partnered with the City of Tampa and Tampa's Downtown Partnership to create an outdoor space that features art from Tampa Bay area artists on Franklin Avenue.

SELMON STATUE



THEA supports and spearheads community initiatives throughout our region that activate spaces and enhance our properties' beauty. In our latest community initiative, we commissioned Joel Randell to create Lee Roy Selmon's sculpture for the Selmon Greenway.

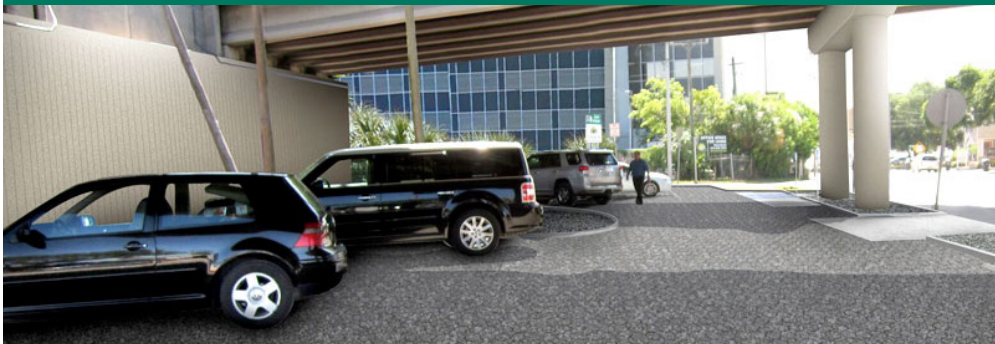
SELMON GREENWAY



THEA's 1.7 mile Selmon Greenway runs east to west through downtown Tampa - mostly in the expressway's shade - and connects with the City's Riverwalk and our own Meridian Avenue Trail. The Greenway is open for anyone who wants to enjoy fresh air, healthy exercise, and downtown Tampa amenities.

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BAY TO BAY BOULEVARD



THEA partnered with the Palma Ceia Homeowners Association to improve the parking lot under the Selmon Expressway overpass on the north side of Bay to Bay Boulevard.

MISSISSIPPI AVENUE



THEA partnered with the Palma Ceia Homeowners Association to improve the landscaping under the Selmon Expressway overpass at Mississippi Avenue.

THEA partners with community organizations on everything from beautification to economic development to education. Through these projects, we are committed to the progress and future of our region.

MORRISON GATEWAY



The Historic Hyde Park Neighborhood Association (HHPNA) hired an architect to design the entryway on Morrison Avenue. THEA worked with the HHPNA's President and the architect to tweak the design to fit our feasibility requirements. THEA then built the brick gateway and landscaped the area under and around the underpass.

SWANN AVENUE



THEA partnered with the Historic Hyde Park Neighborhood Association (HHPNA) to create a pedestrian-friendly space under the Selmon Expressway Swann Avenue overpass. We added landscaping, irrigation, up-lighting, electrical, and an improved and enlarged sidewalk for pedestrians and bikes.

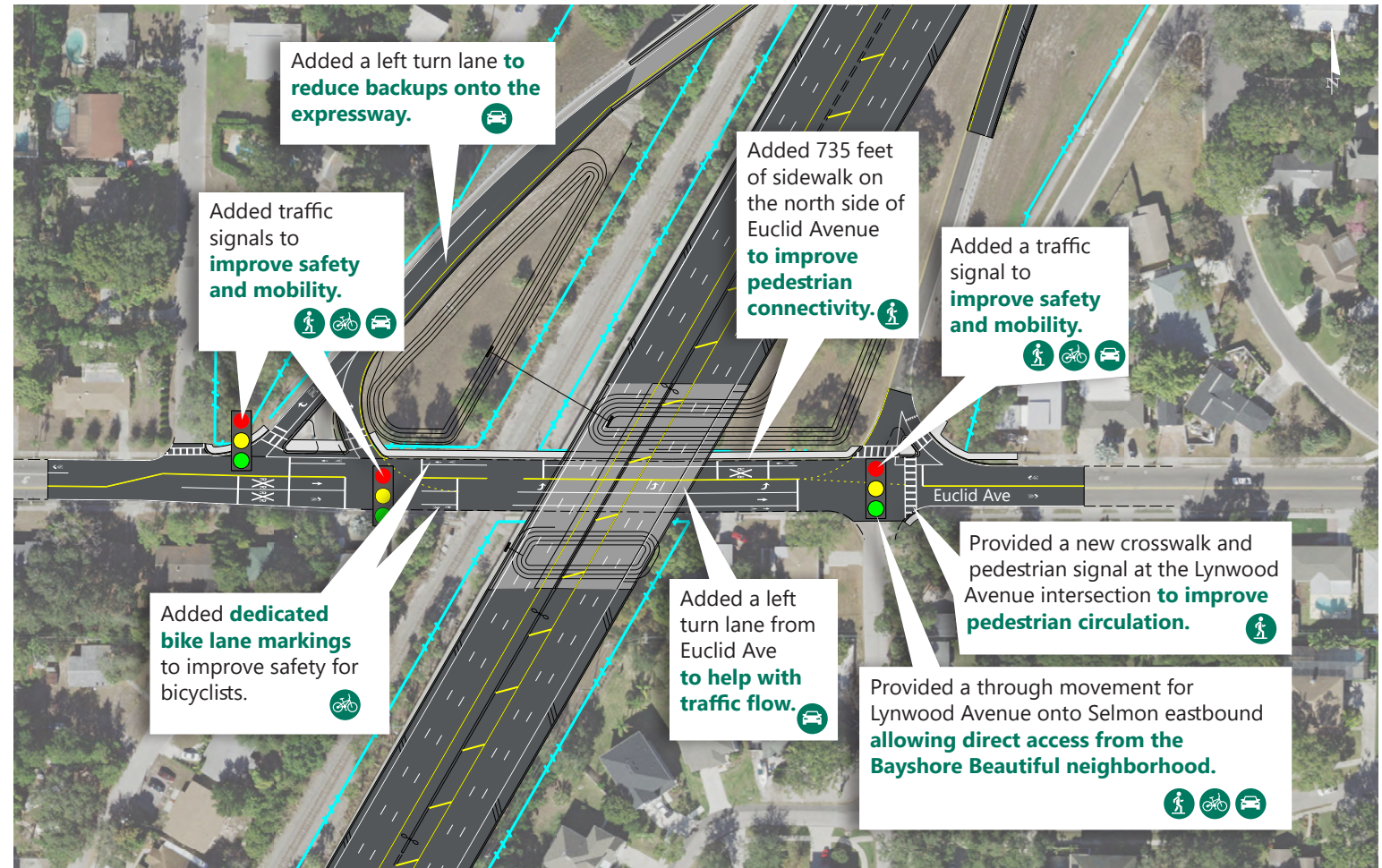

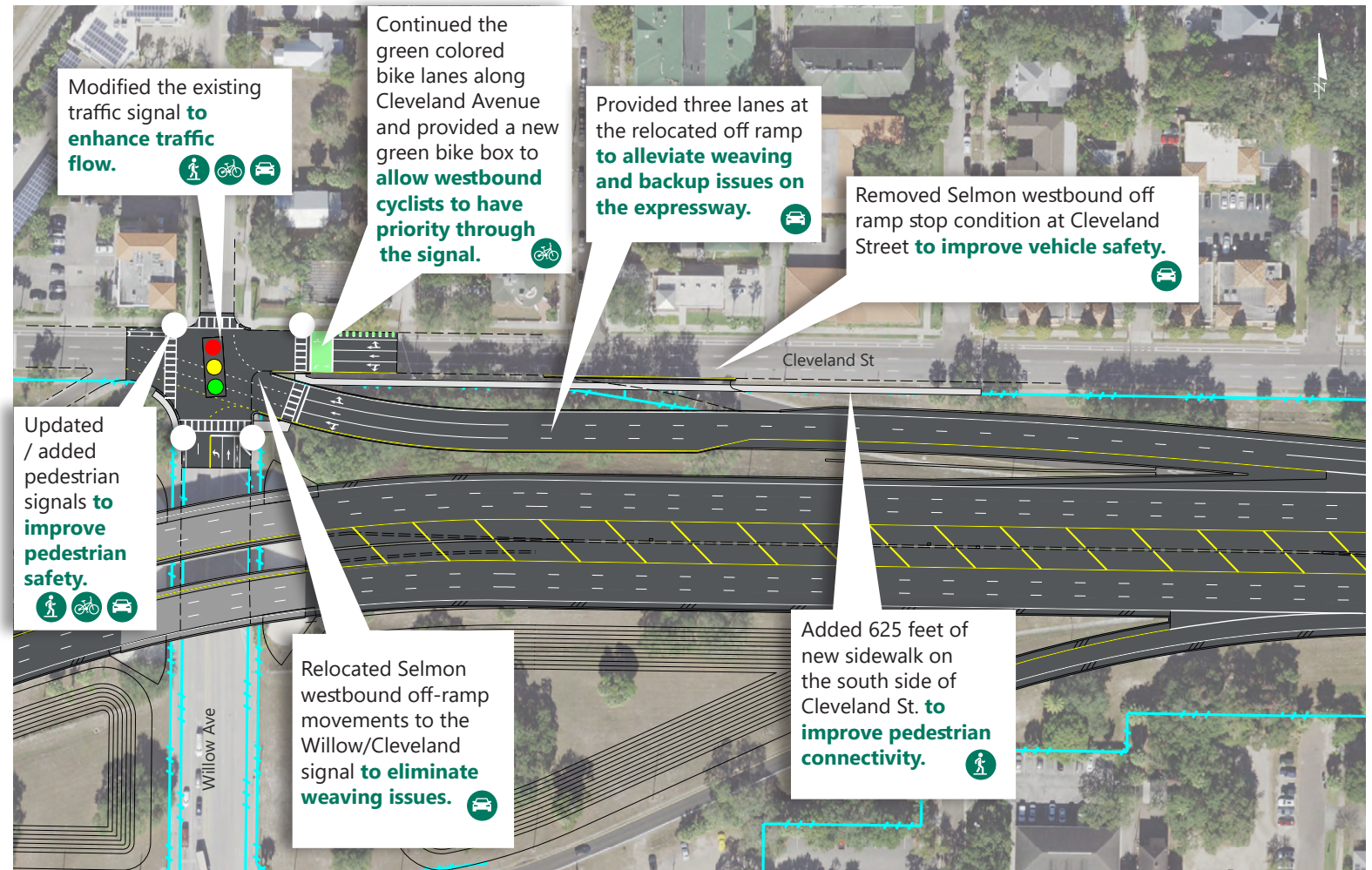

Modified the existing traffic signal to **enhance traffic flow.**



Continued the green colored bike lanes along Cleveland Avenue and provided a new green bike box to **allow westbound cyclists to have priority through the signal.**



Provided three lanes at the relocated off ramp **to alleviate weaving and backup issues on the expressway.**



Removed Selmon westbound off ramp stop condition at Cleveland Street **to improve vehicle safety.**



Updated / added pedestrian signals **to improve pedestrian safety.**



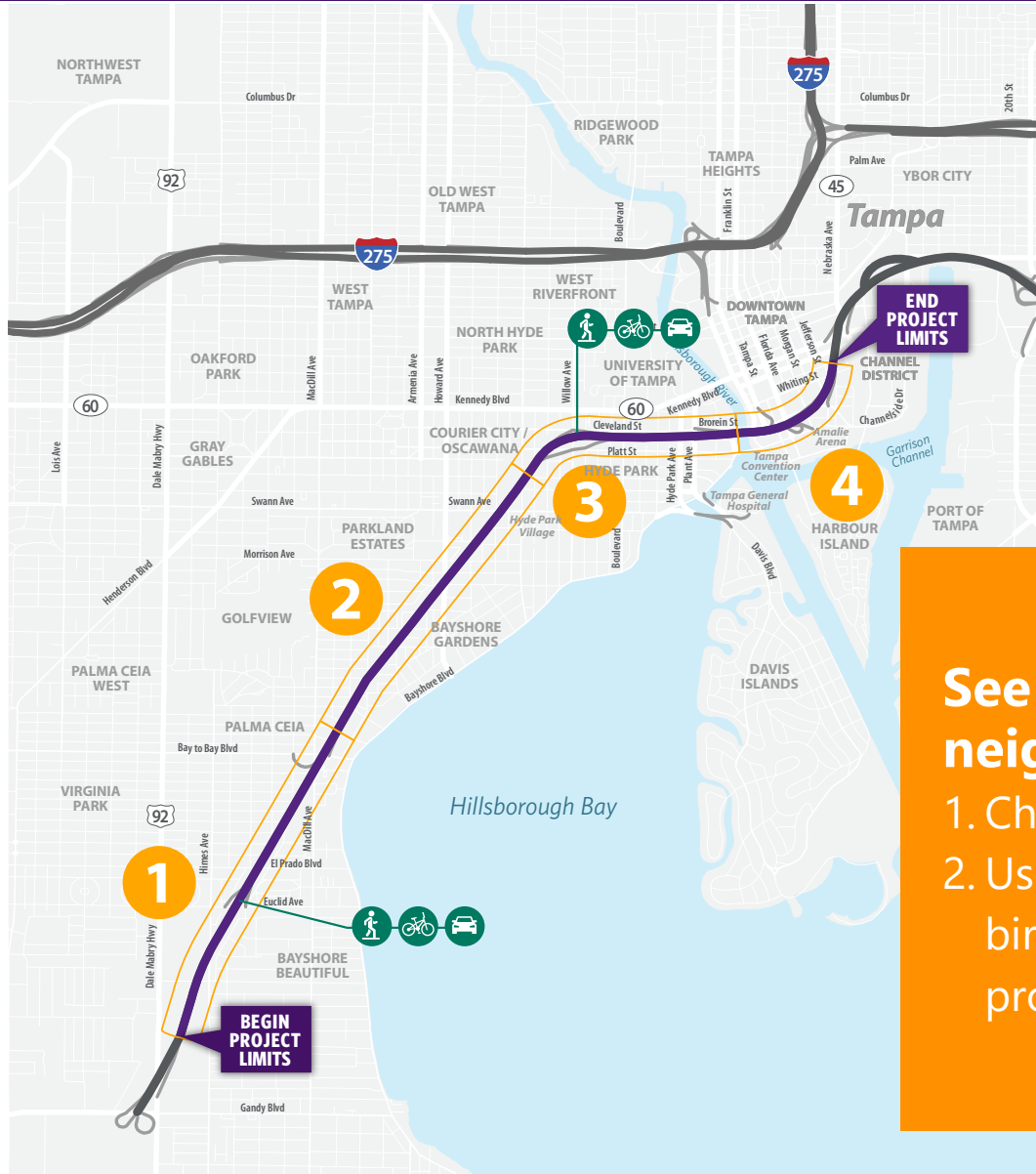
Relocated Selmon westbound off-ramp movements to the Willow/Cleveland signal **to eliminate weaving issues.**



Added 625 feet of new sidewalk on the south side of Cleveland St. **to improve pedestrian connectivity.**
