

- 2. Focus on addressing identified critical life safety issues.
- 3. Prioritize WYDOT asset preservation based on condition of the asset to meet established goals (as appropriate)
- 4. Improve operational effectiveness and efficiency
- 5. Prioritize activities to minimize negative impacts to the public
- 6. Address mobility and capacity through system improvements and enhancements





COVID-19 Pandemic

- Reduced travel highpoint was an approximate 40% reduction
- Reduced fuel tax income
 - FY 2020 approximately \$11M
 - FY 2021 approximately \$23M

2020 Funding Made Available to Cities & Counties

Roadways

- \$23.3M Total
 - \$14.9M is option and \$8.4M required
 - \$20.4M federal funds and \$2.9M state funds
- Includes: Urban areas, BROS, RR crossings, Enhancements, TAP, CMAQ, CRIP, IRP, Community snow removal, and T² (UW)

Airports

- \$32.8M Total
 - \$22.6M federal funds and \$10.2M state funds

Transit - Public Transportation

- \$14.7M Total
- \$13.2M federal funds and \$1.5M state funds

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)	\$2,500,000	A community-based program that expands travel choices and enhances the transportation experience by integrating modes and improving the cultural, historic, and environmental aspects of the transportation system. OP 3-3	Federal (80/20)	Continue program, honor existing agreements.		
Industrial Road Program (IRP)	\$2,000,000	A road construction program created to assist counties with economic development efforts. WS 24-5-101 to 122, \$4,000,000 per biennium, 50% match by county.	State (50/50)	No new projects will be accepted into the program until adequate funding is received		
Transportation Enhancement Activities	\$2,000,000	Districts can budget up to \$400,000 per project to enhance infrastructure on state routes for local entities. OP 3-3	Federal (90/10)	Program will continue but will be periodically reviewed for effectiveness and continuation.		
Context Sensitive Amenities (CSA)	\$1,467,000	A program designed to incorporate context sensitive design solutions into the physical work on WYDOT reconstruction projects within communities. 3% of preliminary construction estimate on projects within urban areas. Annual cost is 6 years of the STIP, including \$4.5 million for I-25/I-80. OP 18-14	Federal (90/10) - WYDOT pays match	Continue program, honor existing agreements; however, require local governments to provide the 10% match. Program will be evaluated periodically.

Commission Road Improvement Program (CRIP)	\$5,000,000	A program created by the Wyoming Transportation Commission to address unique rural major collector road situations. Stated purpose is the possibility of taking a state highway onto the county system. OP 2-	Federal (85/15)	This is a Transportation Commission discretionary program. The program will continue, however, the Commission can make adjustments at anytime.
Surface Transportation Project – Urban (STPU)	\$5,700,000	A road construction program to assist Wyoming urban cities to address road and street needs created by increased traffic generation, changes in land use patterns and other community development characteristics. By definition, an urban municipality is one with a census population greater than 5,000. OP 2-4	Federal (90/10)	Program will continue but will be periodically reviewed for effectiveness and continuation.
Community Snow Removal Payment	\$790,000	WYDOT plows state highways in communities with a population less than 1,500, and communities greater than 5,000 receive STPU. 24-2-111	State - WYDOT provides all funding	WYDOT will suspend contributions for FY 2021. Payments planned for July 2020 will be made.

County Dust Suppression and Mitigation	\$2,000,000	This program was created to address transportation-induced air quality conditions that threaten to place an area or county of the State within the status of air quality non-attainment. Primarily to supply dust suppression material for county roads to keep industrial areas in air quality compliance. Funds are from the CMAQ program. These funds could be spent on other programs. OP 2-12	Federal (80/20)	Continue program, honor existing agreements, however, will evaluate program periodically for continuation.
Bridge Replacement Off System (BROS)	\$1,300,000	A program to replace eligible bridges that are unsafe due to structural deficiencies, physical deterioration, and/or functional obsolescence. The program applies to structures not on the federal-aid system. Required to spend \$1.86 million but have traditionally spent about \$3.2 million.	Federal (90/10)	Continue program, honor existing agreements, however, will evaluate program periodically for continuation.
High Risk Rural Road (HRRR) to counties	\$400,000	Approximately 60% of fatalities occur on rural roads, and the purpose of this program is to achieve a significant reduction in traffic fatalities and incapacitating injuries on rural major or minor collectors, and/or rural local roads. The majority of fatal and incapacitating injury crashes occur on the state highway system.	Federal (90/10)	Continue program, honor existing agreements.








Number of Projects Let & Cost Per Fiscal Year
