

Guiding Principles

- 1. Align expenditures with available revenue amount and source
- 2. Focus on addressing identified critical life safety issues.
- 3. Prioritize WYDOT asset preservation based on condition of the asset to meet established goals (as appropriate)
- 4. Improve operational effectiveness and efficiency
- 5. Prioritize activities to minimize negative impacts to the public
- 6. Address mobility and capacity through system improvements and enhancements


- Determine overall department needs

COVID-19 Pandemic

- Reduced travel highpoint was an approximate 40% reduction
- Reduced fuel tax income
 - FY 2020 approximately \$11M
 - FY 2021 approximately \$23M

2020 Funding Made Available to Cities & Counties

Roadways

- \$23.3M Total
 - \$14.9M is option and \$8.4M required
 - \$20.4M federal funds and \$2.9M state funds
- Includes: Urban areas, BROS, RR crossings, Enhancements, TAP, CMAQ, CRIP, IRP, Community snow removal, and T² (UW)

Airports

- \$32.8M Total
 - \$22.6M federal funds and \$10.2M state funds

Transit - Public Transportation

- \$14.7M Total
- \$13.2M federal funds and \$1.5M state funds

State Funding Budget Modifications

- Community Snow Removal Payment
- Reduce winter maintenance activities
- Reduce Supplementary Information Signs
- Stop applying for discretionary grants
- Closing Select Rest Areas
- Let seasonal closures open later
- Reduce the number of new highway construction project let to contract
- Reduce regular summer maintenance







Bridge Replacement Off System (BROS)

\$3.14M / yr 10% Local match Funding accounted for through 2027

Context Sensitive Amenities (CSA)

Up to 3% of project costs

New requirement is a 10% Local match

Enhancements

\$2.0M / yr Local match 10%

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

\$2.5M / yr Local match 20%

Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ)




